<b>Week 3</b> – Week beginning 4 <sup>th</sup> May 2020	<b>Literacy</b> – Can you write about the seed you planted? What can you see? What have you done to make sure it grows?	<b>People and communities</b> – Find some pictures of you as a child a baby. What has changed? Are there things you couldn't do as a baby but you can do now? Can you find a picture of your grown-ups as a baby; can you see any differences between the photos?	<b>Maths</b> – Go on a shape hunt around the home or outside. Can you find any squares, circles, rectangles and triangles? How many corners and sides can you see? As a challenge can you describe the properties of the shapes? For example, A square has 4 corners and it has 4 sides that are all the same length. Upload what the children tell you to Tapestry with a video.	<b>Expressive Arts</b> - Listen carefully to the music: <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=IEd7Ovt4cWE">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=IEd7Ovt4cWE</a> Can you hear how the music shows the hens and roosters scratching the ground? Can you hear them crowing and clucking? Create your own hens and rooster music using everyday objects.	<b>Physical development</b> - Can you experiment with different ways of moving, move like a rabbit, a dinosaur, a snail. Can you think of other animals you could move like?
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**Please upload your child's learning that they do each week to Tapestry.**
