Week 5 – week beginning 18 th May 2020	Managing feelings and behaviour – Play a game which involves taking turns and playing fairly, such as a board game. Talk to your child about playing by the rules and the importance of sharing. P.S. don't always let your child win!	Physical development – Practise your throwing and catching skills with different sized balls. Can you catch with just one hand? What happens if your get further away? Upload to Tapestry!	Literacy – Go on a walk or look out of your window. Draw and then write about something you see. It could be a bird, or a flower or an animal. For example, I can see a bird. It is black with orange legs. Remember to do your writing independently; use your sound mat to help you!	Understanding the World – Get yourself a fresh carrot and cut off the top of the carrot. Place the top of the carrot in a saucer of water. Watch what happens over the next few days. Keep a diary of what you see. Draw or take photographs of what is happening. Share your findings on Tapestry!	Maths – Go on a coin hunt around the house. How many different coins can you find? Keep a list of all the coins you find and what they are worth. Can you set up your own toy café and pay for snacks? Make labels so you know much things are, pay for the snacks using your money!
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Children must participate in the literacy, maths and phonics learning every week.
