### English

In today's lesson you will learn about the story of The Three Billy Goats Gruff. You will learn the characters and some adjectives to describe them. You will also learn that this story has a problem... the troll! You will be asked to draw your favourite character or your favourite moment in the story.

### RE

For your learning activity this week you need to draw a picture and label what it is you are sorry for and would like forgiveness from God. It could include, making the wrong choices, not sharing your toys, not saying kind words or not listening to your grown-ups.

**Finding it tricky?** Focus on naming the 2D shapes correctly: square, triangle, circle and rectangle. Can you name them correctly when shown each one randomly or select the shape your grown up says?

**Need a challenge?** Play guess the shape game with a grown up, can you guess the shape? Describe the shape and then guess it correctly. For example, "This shape has 3 corners and 3 sides", the answer is a triangle.

**Need a challenge?** Write a sentence to go with your picture, telling us why it is your favourite part or why the character is your favourite. Maybe you could use some adjectives in your writing!

**Need a challenge?** Write a sentence to go with your picture.

When your child is writing, either for phonics, English activities or for their own writing during play, please ensure that they are doing it independently. This means that the children are using the sounds they hear and write them down. For example, some children may only hear the first sound, if that is the case that is all they should write. Or a child may hear some of the sounds in the word but not all, this is perfectly acceptable and they should only write what they hear.

Please upload any learning that you'd like to share with us to Tapestry. When you upload your child's learning to Tapestry it continues their learning journey, helping
