In an additional English lesson this week you will have a go at changing the story of The Three Billy Goats Gruff! You will change the characters slightly but follow the same theme, there is a problem and you must have a plan to overcome it! You will draw the story map to help you retell the story of the Frilly Goats Gruff.

Finding it tricky? Only change one character in the story and tell us all about that character. Remember to label it with the sounds that you hear!

Need a challenge? Can you make up a completely different story to the one that is shown, adding different characters, but still following the idea that there is a problem and the characters need to come up with a plan to overcome it. You could use the story board again to draw and then write out your story.

You will learn about the different countries that we have in our world. We will find out that people talk different languages in their different countries and have a go at saying 'hello' in a different language.

Can you upload a video of you saying hello in a different language and tell us what language you are speaking? If you speak another language at home, other than English, maybe you can upload a video of you speaking in that language too?

When your child is writing, either for phonics, English activities or for their own writing during play, please ensure that they are doing it independently. This means that the children are using the sounds they hear and write them down. For example, some children may only hear the first sound, if that is the case that is all they should write. Or a child may hear some of the sounds in the word but not all, this is perfectly acceptable and they should only write what they hear.

Please upload any learning that you'd like to share with us to Tapestry. When you upload your child's learning to Tapestry it continues their learning journey, helping us and you see the progress that your child is making. Tapestry is a positive way of teachers responding to the activities that your child is doing and provide feedback if necessary. We would really appreciate it if **all** parents/guardians uploaded **at least one piece of phonics, English and maths learning** to Tapestry a week.
