### Maths

Children will be learning the concept of zero. What zero is, what it looks like, what it means, how to write it and where it comes on a number line.

**Finding this tricky?** Use the number cards 0 – 5 and collect objects to show quantity of each number card. This will allow the children to physically see how zero means nothing.

**Need a challenge?** Challenge yourself with maths, could you maybe find one more/less than a number above 10, could you make up your own number sentence, maybe learn all about a new number?

### English

In this lesson you will learn how to draw a story map of a book we have listened to.

**Finding this tricky?** Draw one picture from the story.

**Need a challenge?** Can you write a sentence about your favourite part of the book? Or you could try writing the whole story, making a storybook with pictures.

When your child is writing, either for phonics, English activities or for their own writing during play, please ensure that they are doing it independently. This means that the children are using the sounds they hear and write them down. For example, some children may only hear the first sound, if that is the case that is all they should write. Or a child may hear some of the sounds in the word but not all, this is perfectly acceptable and they should only write what they hear.

Please upload any learning that you'd like to share with us to Tapestry. When you upload your child's learning to Tapestry it continues their learning journey, helping us and you see the progress that your child is making. Tapestry is a positive way of teachers responding to the activities that your child is doing and provide feedback if necessary.
